QUALITY COUNTS VERIFICATION REQUIRED FOR ALL 2016-2017 Texas Major Livestock Shows



Quality Counts verification is required for all youth exhibiting livestock (market and/or breeding) at major livestock shows in Texas (including the Ft. Worth Livestock Show, San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo, Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, Star of Texas Fair in Austin, San Angelo Livestock Show, Sandhills Stock Show in Odessa, State Fair of Texas in Dallas, and Heart O' Texas Fair in Waco). The verification process will require junior exhibitors to pass an online test that measures their knowledge on

quality assurance and character education content items. The Quality Counts Program has now been in existence statewide for six years. Over this time, it has reached an average of 30,000 youth per year through the 4-H and FFA Programs. The program outcomes clearly demonstrate youth being more knowledgeable of best management practices associated with livestock projects. More importantly, the program's impact has demonstrated positive changes in personal character attributes as well as adoption of livestock best management practices.

If you have already taken the test you do not have to take it again unless you have taken the test as a Junior/Intermediate and have now turned 14. For more information contact Derrick Drury at 830-741-6180 or go to http://qualitycounts.tamu.edu/.

HEIFER VALIDATION PROGRAM

Texas is privileged to have the largest junior breeding heifer program in the nation. However, the sheer size of Texas, diversity in counties and beef breed associations has created some challenges for effectively and fairly managing the program. Because of numerous breed divisions offered, there are inconsistencies in how breed associations record purchase and transfer information. Heifer Validation is being initiated to ensure a level playing field for all junior breeding beef heifer exhibitors and to present a unified approach to verifying breeding beef heifer registration papers, ownership and physical possession.

Participating major livestock shows are requiring all junior breeding heifers to be tattooed, brands recorded and hair samples collected for the DNA Assay. All heifers must be validated by the County Validation Committee. Validation will take place **Saturday**, **October 22nd** from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm at Paul Aelvoet's farm south of Hondo. FOOD & NUTRITION PROJECTS

It's time to fire up the grill and get cooking... the 4-H Food and Nutrition projects began in September. The food and nutrition project helps participants learn to make healthy food choices, improve energy and alertness, reduce disease and illness risks, and gain knowledge of nutrients. Major learning experiences are centered around nutrition, menu planning, food buying, preparation and food safety, careers, and cultural influences.

SALE offers contests outside the ring. Top winners awarded scholarships.

Food Challenge: The San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo hosts a Food Challenge Show modeled after the hit TV Series "Iron Chef." This Food Challenge gives both FFA and 4-H students from across Texas the chance to showcase their cooking skills, but also requires the students to know preparation, nutritional facts, and origins of ingredients. Exhibitors compete as individuals in this competition in which they are randomly assigned into one of four categories: Bread & Cereal, Fruit & Vegetable, Main Dish, and Nutritious Snacks. The top placing exhibitors in each category advance to the Final Challenge for additional prizes and awards.

Junior Judging Contests: Junior Judging Contests are popular to Texas 4-H and FFA participants because of their value in terms of developing critical thinking and communication skills. A broad variety of contests are hosted each year at the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo to meet the diverse interests of our exhibitors. Exhibitors may compete as individuals or in teams in the following contests: Consumer Decision Making, Dairy Judging, Horse Bowl, Horse Judging, Livestock Judging, Meat Judging, Poultry Judging, Wildlife Habitat, and Wool Judging.

RECORDKEEPING

4-H RECORDBOOKS



It's time to start keeping records for your 2016-2017 Projects. Keeping records is a great way to hold on to your memories about your incredible adventures in 4-H. Record keeping is also a great way to develop skills in time management, communication, setting goals and

deadlines, money management and project evaluations. In an effort to update the current recordbook system a committee has developed an online program with a data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing and printing.

- There will be three (3) levels of recordbooks based on 4-H age (junior, intermediate, and senior). Information requested for each level will progressively add on to each other. The junior & intermediate books are significantly simplified from past recordbooks. The senior level book is similar to the past record book with some minor edits.
- Parts of the report form will be standardized to allow for ease of completion and judging.
- Much of the data from previous recordbooks that a member may have saved on their home computer may be "cut and pasted" into the new form.
- All 4-H members will begin using the new online forms or a new paper form that will be available for download from the Texas 4-H website.
- Recordbooks will still be printed and turned in (in hardcopy form) to be judged by the deadline set by your local County Extension Office.

4-H PROJECT RECORD FORMS FOR ALL ANIMAL AND POULTRY PROJECTS

Record keeping is an important part of the 4-H Program and a good life skill to have. Records teach the skill of record keeping, encourage good work, show progress, growth and accomplishment, helps direct future plans and helps determine recognition.



The 4-H Project Record should not be confused with the "big" project recordbook in 4-H. This record is solely on your animal or poultry project and must be turned in at the end of your animal project. This is the record that is turned in along with your "thank you" notes after the County show.

As your project is conducted, management and activity records should be kept on a daily, weekly and monthly basis. At the end of your project summarize your project and reflect on specific things you learned in your project, list all activities you participated in your project, list awards and recognition you received, any leadership you may have displayed and any community service related to your project.

Again, this is a great way to plan for future projects as well as show your progress, growth and accomplishments.

COMMERCIAL HEIFER RECORD BOOKS

The Junior Commercial Heifer Show and Sale is an opportunity for junior exhibitors to show their commercial beef projects. Exhibitors will be required to participate in an interview beginning on the day of the show, record book judging will follow immediately after the heifer judging. Record Book directions:

- Information should be correct and legible.
- Documentation of all expenditures should be included.
- No additional photos should be included.
- Record Books may be bound as exhibitor chooses.
- Official Record Book must be used.
- No alterations of Record Book.
- Record Books are evaluated for completeness and accuracy and not on performance data.

SCHOLARSHIP WORKSHOP

TEXAS 4-H OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP WORKSHOP

Are you a high school junior or graduating Senior? Planning on attending college or a technical school?

If so, join us for a 4-H Scholarship Workshop on **Wednesday, November 16th at 6:00 pm**. The workshop will be held at the Medina County AgriLife Extension Office and will include: overview of the scholarship processing including the scoring and selection; criteria and eligibility; detailed review of each section of the application; and general information about college financial aid. Megan Logan, District 10 Extension Program Specialist will be conducting the workshop.

There is a scholarship category for most everyone, including:

Baccalaureate Scholarship: For students interested in a four-year degree.

Technical Certification: For students interested in joining the workforce soon after finishing high school. Some 4-H approved examples are vocational nursing, veterinary technology, and electrical design technology. More 4-H approved vocational programs are listed on page 5 of the Opportunity Scholarship Application and Guideline page.

Courageous Heart: For students who continued school and 4-H during hardship.

Collegiate Scholarships: For former 4-H students currently attending a college or university. You will need at least 30 hours of college credit and a GPA of 2.7 to apply.





TEXAS 4-H AGE AND YEAR

Youth may participate in 4-H from September 1st of grade 3 through August 31st following completion of grade 12 with these restrictions:

Texas 4-H will have new membership eligibility based on SCHOOL GRADE and not age. The new eligibility rules and guideline are:

Minimum age - 8 (in addition to being in the 3rd grade)
Maximum age - 18 (as of August 31, 2016)
