Work Days are:


Monday-January 23, 2023 @ 4:30 pm.

#### PROJECT CLIPPING...FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS...

There is an opportunity to have your animals clipped in preparation for the county livestock show. If you are a first time exhibitor and need assistance with swine, cattle, goats and lambs please contact the Extension office at 830.741.6180.

The "No Pass, No Show" rule is in effect for the Medina County Junior Livestock Show and all Major Livestock Shows.

Academically ineligible exhibitors will not be allowed to show their animal AND the animal may not be shown by anyone else.

This Record Form must be completed, signed and given to your club managers along with your thank you notes to be eligible to receive your MCJLS auction check.

To be eligible to receive your MCJLS Auction check early you will need to participate in at least one set-up or clean up day, with a minimum of 3 hours of work, have no family members owing money on your auction check and have completed your thank you notes and project record form.

# 4-H Recordbooks

Keeping records is a great way to hold on to your memories about your incredible adventures in 4-H. Record keeping is also a great way to develop skills in time management, communication, setting goals and deadlines, money management and project evaluations. In an effort to update the current record book system a committee has developed an online program with a data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing and printing.

- There will be three (3) levels of record books based on 4-H age (junior, intermediate, and senior). Information requested for each level will progressively add on to each other.
- All 4-H members will begin using the new online forms or a new paper form that is available for download from the Texas 4-H website.
- Record books will still be printed and turned in (in hardcopy form) to be judged. The 2023 deadline is June 12th.

# PHOTOGRAPHY

#### DISTRICT PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

The District 10 Photography contest is open to all 4-H members in District 10. All photographs must have been taken by the 4-H member between January 1, 2022 and February 20, 2023. Entries must follow the state 4-H Photography rules, division guidelines, class description and general guideline.

You can enter up to 3 photos in separate categories. Registration will be held on 4-H online between February 1st-20th. Cost for Registration is \$15 per person.

#### STATE PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

The Texas 4-H & Youth Development Photography contest will be displayed during the 2023 Texas 4-H Roundup and is open to all senior age 4-H members. 2022-2023 theme is "Reflections". Reflection photography uses reflective surfaces to create an artistic "echo" of a scene. It includes photos that are creatively composed to capture an image from a reflective surface. The reflection should play a significant part of the image's composition.

Along with the theme category there are 14 other categories in which to enter. Each county may have one entry per category.

Entries will be taken between April 1-15th, 2023

Categories for 2022-2023 are Animals-Domestic, Animals-Wildlife, Catch-All, Details and Macro, Elements of Design, Enhanced, Food, Landscape and Nature, Leading Line, Long Exposure, Motion/Action, People, Plant/Flora, Shadow/Silhouette, the 2022-2023 Theme "Reflections".

# **TEXAS 4H FOUNDATION OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP**

Texas 4-H Opportunity Scholarships are academic scholarships awarded each year to applicants based on their academic record, 4-H experience, and financial need (for scholarships for which it is a required criterion). The scholarship program is overseen by the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation. An estimated \$2.2 million will be given at the Texas 4-H Roundup Scholarship Assembly. Scholarship values range from \$3000-\$20,000 with over 200 scholarships being awarded in 2022. For more information go to:


### 4-H Day @ The State Capital

Minimum age—8 (in addition to being in the 3rd grade)

Maximum age—18 (as of August 31, 2022)

SENIOR: Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12

INTERMEDIATE: Grades 6, 7, and 8

JUNIOR: Grades 3, 4, and 5
