## 4-H RECORDBOOKS

It's time to start keeping records for your 2022-2023 Projects. Keeping records is a great way to hold on to your memories about your incredible adventures in 4-H. Record keeping is also a great way to develop skills in time management, communication, setting goals and deadlines, money management and project evaluations. In an effort to update the current recordbook system a committee has developed an online program with a data entry system that easily allows for updates, editing and printing.

- There will be three (3) levels of recordbooks based on 4-H age (junior, intermediate, and senior). Information requested for each level will progressively add on to each other. The junior & intermediate books are significantly simplified from past recordbooks. The senior level book is similar to the past record book with some minor edits.
- Parts of the report form will be standardized to allow for ease of completion and judging.
- Much of the data from previous recordbooks that a member may have saved on their home computer may be "cut and pasted" into the new form
- All 4-H members will begin using the new online forms or a new paper form that will be available for download from the Texas 4-H website.
- Recordbooks will still be printed and turned in (in hardcopy form) to be judged by the deadline **Monday, June 12th** to the County Extension Office.

### **Bronze Star Award Criteria (1-page minimum essay)**

The Bronze Star Award is awarded each year to outstanding 4-Hers in Medina County based on personal development, leadership, outstanding achievement in 4-H projects and activities and contribution to the overall 4-H program. **Junior age division 4-Hers (3rd – 5th grade)** of the current 4-H year may apply for this award. The applicant must be 9-11 years of age as of September 1, 2022 and completed at least 2 years in 4-H including the current year.

### **Silver Star Award (2-page minimum essay)**

The Silver Star Award is awarded each year to outstanding 4-Hers in Medina County based on personal development, leadership, outstanding achievement in 4-H projects and activities and contribution to the overall 4-H program. **Intermediate age division 4-Hers (6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade) of the current 4-H year may apply for this award.** The applicant must be 12-14 years of age as of September 1, 2022 and completed at least 2 years in 4-H including the current year.

### **Gold Star Award (2-page minimum essay)**

The Gold Star Award is the highest achievement award at the county level and is to recognize **senior (ages 15 and over)** 4-H members for outstanding achievement. Will be awarded only once in a member's 4-H career. The applicant must be at least 15 years of age as of September 1, 2022 and completed at least 3 years in 4-H including the current year.

**To apply for award please write a minimum 2-page essay, answering the following questions:**

1. How did you become involved in 4-H?
2. What does 4-H mean to you?
3. What is your main project in 4-H?
4. Who has influenced you the most since you have been in 4-H?
5. What has been your most exciting/disappointing 4-H experience?
6. What is the greatest life skill you feel you have gained through your involvement in 4-H?
7. How can you best promote 4-H?
8. What would you tell someone who knew nothing about 4-H to get them to join?
9. Why do you deserve the Bronze/Silver/Gold Star award?

This essay should be 2 pages in length unless applying for bronze star award.

**Essays must be submitted to the Extension office by June 12<sup>th</sup> – Interviews will be scheduled after this date.**

Logan DeCock is going to Tarleton State University and majoring in Mechanical Engineering. He also plans to fish collegiately while there.



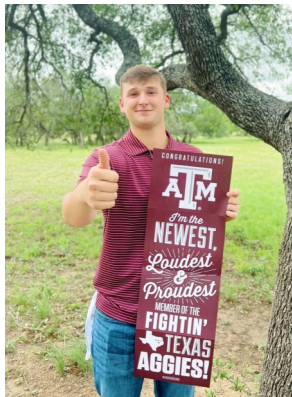

THE STATEWIDE TEXAS 4-H CALF ROPING AND BREAKAWAY SCHOOL WILL BE HELD JUNE 18TH-22ND IN STEPHENVILLE TEXAS AT THE PARK YOUR PONY AREA. THIS EVENT WAS DEVELOPED IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE YOUNG PEOPLE TO DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS AND TO EXERCISE THEIR ABILITIES IN WORKING WITH YOUNGER MEMBERS IN ROPING ACTIVITIES IN 4-H.

PARTICIPATION IS OPEN TO ALL 4-HER'S STATEWIDE WITH APPLICATIONS BEING ACCEPTED ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE BASIS WITH FIRST PRIORITY TO THOSE 4-HER'S WHO ARE 12 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER. THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS WILL BE 50.

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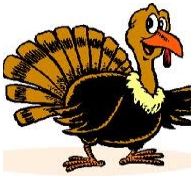
